



Director of Youth Ministry Job Posting

Hodges Boulevard Presbyterian Church in Jacksonville, Florida is seeking a part-time Director of Youth Ministry to oversee discipleship of youth in 6th through 12th grades. This warm, welcoming, PCUSA congregation is described as “big enough to make a difference – small enough to be a family”. The position would report directly to the pastor, collaborate with the Director of Faith Formation, and oversee a team of volunteers.

Primary responsibilities for the position include:

- Work with an established volunteer team to continue to design, develop, and implement an engaging, growing, and sustainable ministry for youth
- Oversee all education programs, events, and trips for mid-high youth (6th-8th graders) as well as high school youth (9th-12th graders)
- Provide care and support for students connected with the ministry and church
- Serve as the primary liaison and advocate for the youth
- Communicate regularly with key ministry stakeholders (parents, volunteer leaders, day school families, larger congregation, local community)
- Assist clergy in relevant related responsibilities
- Develop and maintain the annual youth ministry budget
- Engage a variety of adults in leadership and support of the ministry, including parents and families of current students

Qualifications for this position are:

- College graduate
- Understanding of pre-adolescent and adolescent development so as to be well equipped to connect and care for persons at this unique life stage
- Grounded in the Reformed Theology undergirding the tradition of the Presbyterian Church USA
- Ability to work as part of a team
- Willing to be coachable and work within the framework that has been established for sustainability
- Proficient with social media platforms
- Ability to organize, focus, and multi-task
